



# PRACTICE MEDICINE IN WOODLAND HILLS

Kaiser Permanente’s Woodland Hills Medical Center opened in 1986 on a 28-acre site in the high-tech Warner Center in the West San Fernando Valley. Our medical center houses 212 beds for inpatient service for the major specialties, and for some tertiary specialties, including neurosurgery, tertiary NICU, and plastic surgery.

The Woodland Hills Medical Center supports several satellite medical offices with one each in Woodland Hills and Simi Valley, two in Thousand Oaks, plus a behavioral health office in nearby Reseda. Together, the hospital and medical offices — with 250 physicians and a support staff of nearly 2,400 — provide services for nearly 165,000 Kaiser Permanente members. Patients visit our offices from communities throughout the San Fernando Valley, as well as Westlake, Malibu, Calabasas, Thousand Oaks, Agoura, and Simi Valley.

The Woodland Hills Medical Center is part of the Valleys Service Area that includes a medical center in Panorama City and the Bakersfield medical offices. As a relatively new medical center, Woodland Hills offers physicians an opportunity to become part of an innovative team that practices quality

medicine, and is committed to expanding existing services and introducing new ways of delivering care using advanced diagnostic and therapeutic modalities. Medical education and physician participation in practice design are integral parts of the Woodland Hills’ philosophy. Also, many of our physicians have teaching appointments at the nearby University of California, Los Angeles and the University of Southern California.



In addition, we have our own in-house Family Medicine Residency Program which affords experience in Adult Medicine, Prenatal Care, Women’s Health, Pediatrics, and Behavioral Science, Orthopedics and Physical Medicine.

The West San Fernando Valley offers easy access to such ideal residential communities as Woodland Hills, Bell Canyon, Calabasas, Encino, Westlake Village, Agoura, and Thousand Oaks, where there are excellent schools and colleges, and contemporary shopping centers. Opportunities for recreational, cultural and professional fulfillment abound. Malibu Canyon, Santa Barbara (via the famous Pacific Coast Highway), Lake Arrowhead, Palm Springs and the nearby beaches and mountains are easily accessible, as are downtown Los Angeles and Westwood Village.
